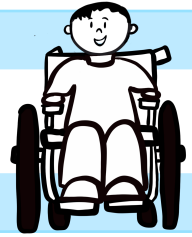


Q & A WITH BONNY

Is *Recess Magic* a true story?

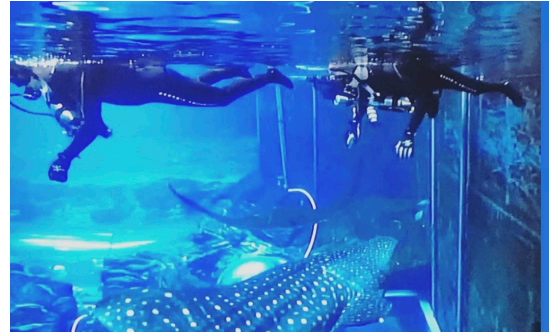
